## Technical Meeting Wrap-Up - February 2018





Delkor Rail is a world leading supplier of bonded resilient rail fastening systems and has been providing innovative track solutions worldwide for over 30 years. Delkor resilient rail fasteners are designed to reduce structure borne noise and vibration which is induced by passing trains over the track form. Delkor systems have been extensively used in Australia and are currently being installed on Sydney Metro Northwest.

Our February PWI Technical Meeting was held on was held on Thursday 22nd February 2018 and was proudly sponsored by Delkor Rail.

Liam Turbet, Technical Engineer at Delkor Rail presented Delkor's award-winning work in designing a reliable and resilient track fastening system to cope with the unique constraints and operating conditions of the London Underground.

London Underground (The Tube) was the world's first underground rail metro and has been in continuous use since

1863. The Tube moves over 4.5 million people daily making it one of the busiest metro systems in the world.

In its 150 years of service, the Underground has been expanded, updated and upgraded on a constant basis. While not quite original, the traditional rail track fastening systems are old, offer virtually no resilience and require a lot of maintenance which is a costly and time consuming exercise.

Delkor Rail worked in conjunction with London Underground Track Delivery Unit to design a rail track fastening system to replace the existing traditional forms.

The London Underground team were looking for a system that could deal with the high wheel-rail forces induced by the tight track alignment without fatiguing whilst being simple, reliable, offer resilience, reduce structure borne vibration and noise and deliver virtually maintenance free operation.

After an international tender process, the Delkor Rail baseplates were selected as the preferred solution and a number of new baseplates were designed to accommodate the operating conditions and also fit within the tight required footprint imposed by the existing tunnel and track structure design.

As well as customising the baseplates, Delkor Rail also assisted with an installation methodology that would suit the tight constraints of the Deep Tube network. The first installations were successfully completed in 2014 on the deep tube Central Line.

Since then Delkor together with the Track Delivery Unit has developed baseplate solutions for not only the plain line but also for Checkrail and Turnout applications.

The work completed to date was recognised by winning the 2017 UK Rail Industry Awards (UKRIA) for Design Innovation.

## Technical Meeting Wrap-Up - April 2018





Sydney Trains commenced operations on 1 July 2013, operating rail services across the metropolitan Sydney area bounded by Berowra, Emu Plains, Macarthur and Waterfall.

As well as maintaining trains, Sydney Trains also operates the network-wide Rail Management Centre, providing train control services to all operators on the Sydney metropolitan network, and is responsible for maintenance of over \$32 billion in assets, including tracks, trains, signals, overhead wiring, stations and facilities.

Our April PWI Technical Meeting was held on was held on Wednesday 18th April 2018 and was proudly sponsored by Sydney Trains.

John McLeod, Professional Head of Track Engineering at Sydney Trains and Prof. Huijun Li from the University of Wollongong presented their research into crack propagation and squat growth in rails, particularly under wet conditions.

Theoretical research hypothesises that the hydraulic entrapment of water is critical to crack propagation associated with squat growth. This explains why squats do not occur in track inside tunnels. However, metallurgical evidence from exservice rails damaged by the presence of water at the wheel and rail interface is lacking.

A localised section of rail was discovered to have suffered





severe surface damage as a result of water dripping from an air-conditioning system located in the tunnel roof.

This section of rail offered an ideal controlled location for a detailed metallurgical investigation of the formation of white etching layers (WELs) under both dry and wet conditions. The study would also examine the relationship between WELs and squat initiation and the mechanics of water on crack propagation and squat growth of ex-service rail.

This presentation revealed some of the surprising evidence gathered during this study and discussed the potential impacts for the rail industry in the treatment and prevention of squat defects.


